Sarah Pearson (nee Phillips)

Sarah lived in Boxted until her late teens and her father, Ted Phillips, still lives in the village.

Sarah, whose mother, Angie, died of Motor Neurone disease, took up running to raise funds for the Motor Neurone Disease Association (MNDA) in memory of her mother.

Sarah, who was born with cerebral palsy, discovered she was good at running and eventually became part of the GB Para triathlon team and won several competitions in her category. She was European Champion and then won a Bronze medal in the World Championship.

Sarah is a psychologist specialising in people suffering from disabilities, particularly soldiers returning from the Afghanistan. In October she is taking part in a Triathlon with former CSgt Marty Wilson who sustained gunshot wounds to the head, which left him with significant cognitive issues. The funds raised will go to four charities all of which have supported people who have experienced brain injury.

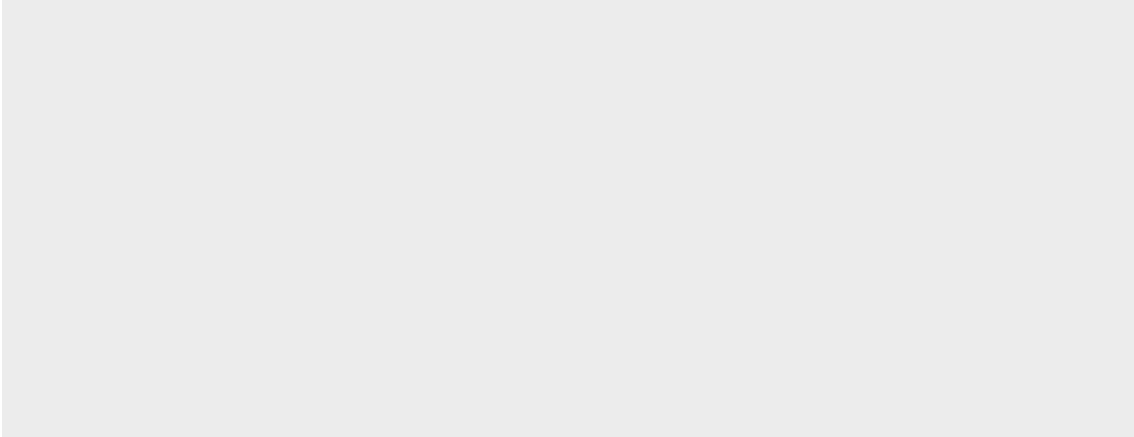

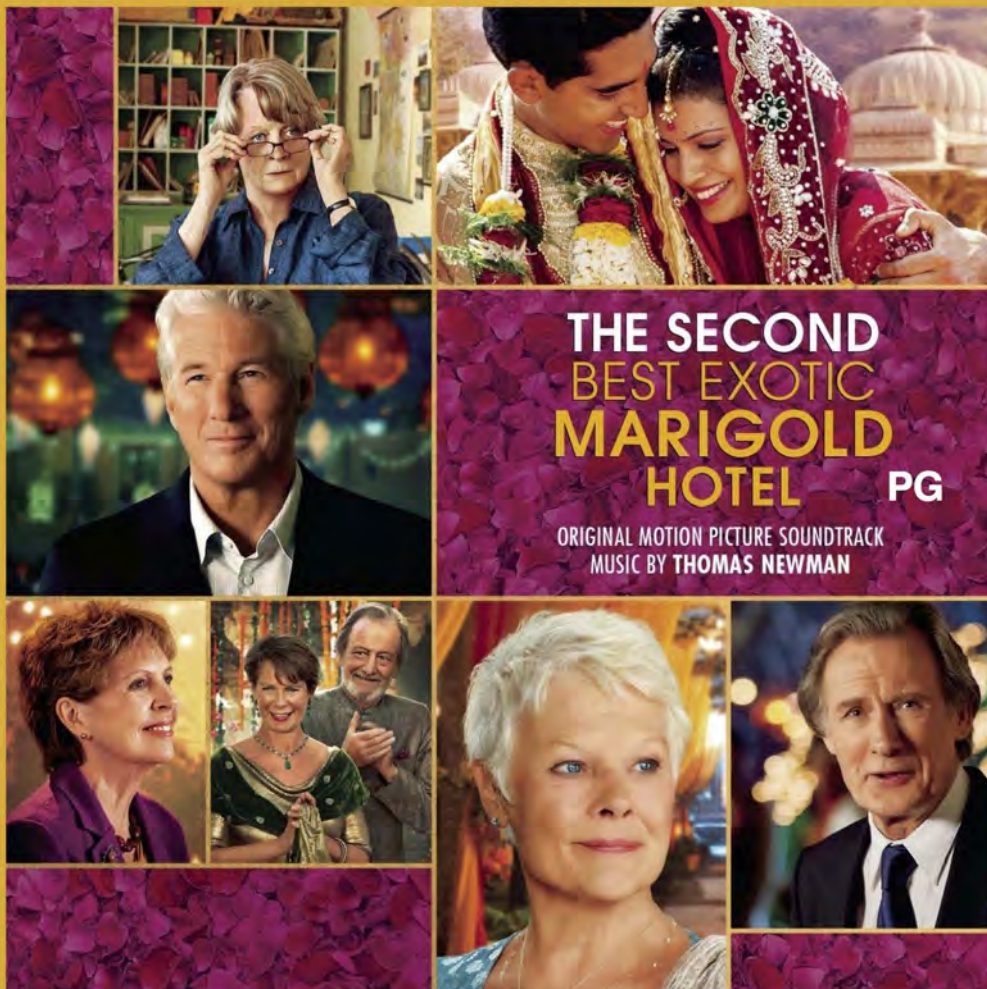

Neighbourhood Watch

Two burglaries have recently been committed in Langham. The first was at an address in Park Lane, Langham between 12 Noon on Thursday 20th and 2:00pm Saturday 22d August. Entry was gained by smashing a ground floor window and opening the window next to it. On entering the burglar alarm was activated and the person fled the scene without taking anything.

The second was at an address in Wick Road, Langham between 12 Noon and 2:00pm on Saturday 22nd August. The side gate was forced open, suffering damage and entry to the house was attempted by using a garden spade to force the rear patio doors. A pedal cycle was stolen from the shed.

Improvement work starts on A133 Colne Bank Avenue

As part of the multi-million pound transport investment previously announced for Colchester, Essex County Council will be improving and widening the A133 Colne Bank Avenue.



The section between Colne Bank and The Albert roundabout is a pinch-point for traffic, so the road will be widened from three lanes to four, with two lanes running in each direction.

Surveying and other preliminary works start this month and the scheme is scheduled by highways engineers to finish in spring 2016.

Trading Standards top 10 complaints revealed



Second hand cars and home maintenance and improvements are among the most common complaints in the last 12 months identified by the public in a top 10 released by Essex Trading Standards.

The top ten also includes: Furniture, large domestic appliances, glazing products and installations, food and drink, clothing, car repairs and servicing, professional services, personal computers, accessories and software.
