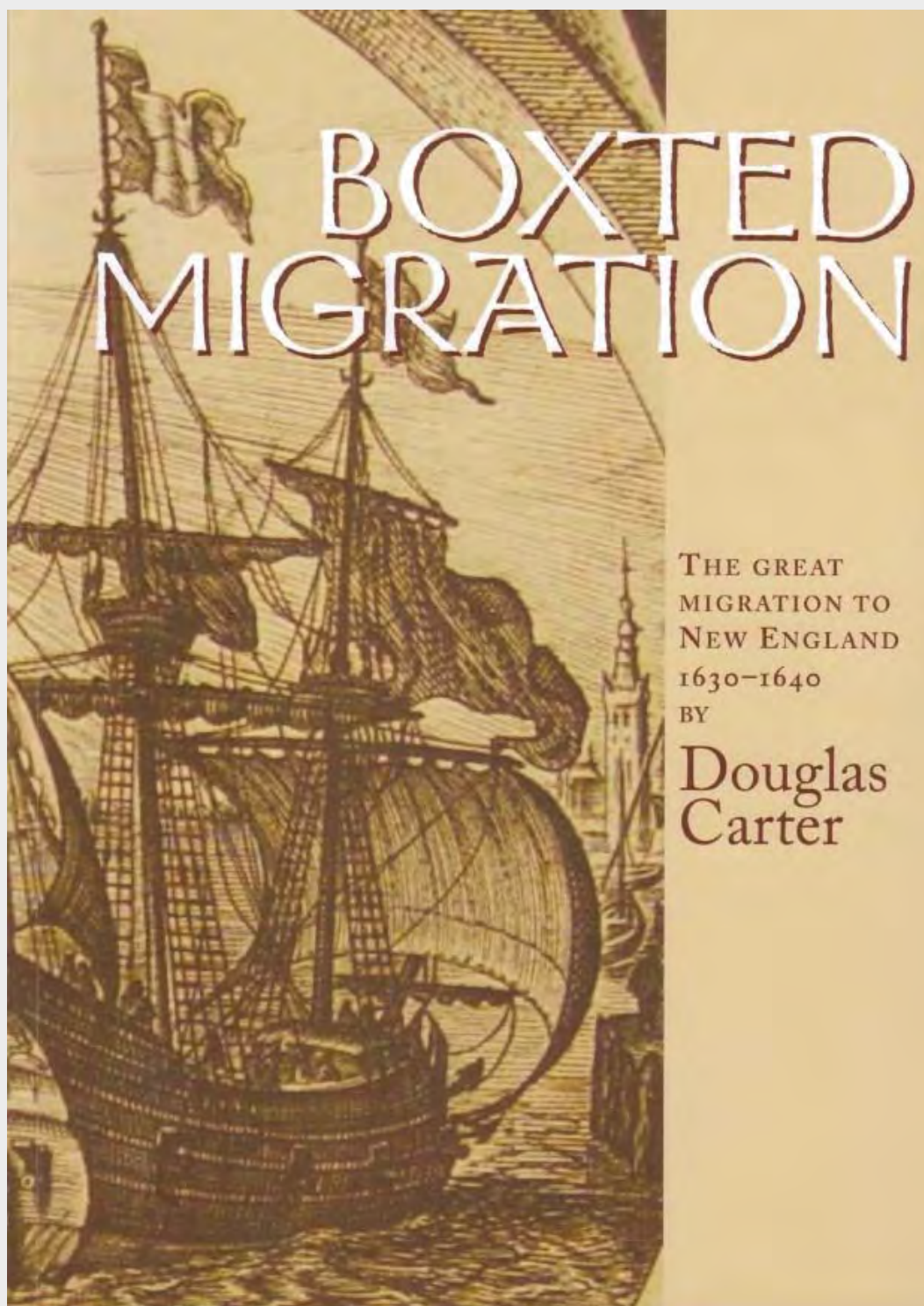
Meet next on Saturday May 9 in Langham Community Centre from 11.15 - 1.15 pm.
